FAMILY BLESSINGS

A sermon by Rev. R. V. Gibbs, Pastor in Morgantown, Kentucky

Today I would like to speak to you about family blessings. The scripture lesson is found in Psalm 126; "Blessed is every one that feareth the Lord; that walketh in his ways. For thou shalt eat the labour of thine hands: happy shalt thou be, and it shall be well with thee Thy wife shall be as a fruitful vine by the sides of thine house: thy children like olive plants round about thy table. Behold, that thus shall the man be blessed that feareth the Lord. The Lord shall bless thee out of Zion: and thou shalt see the good of Jerusalem all the days of thy life. Yea, thou shalt see thy children's children, and peace upon Israel."

Of all the things that God has intrusted us with, the most valuable of all is the building of a christian home. A howe where love is mutual between husband and wife and God is given first place in all decisions that are made. A home where children are considered a sacred trust that God has given us.

In these days when the musdering of children by abortion is considered a mothers right. We need to realize that the caring and rearing of children is a sacred trust and that God's blessings will frow to the mother and father that will honor the principles given them in His Holy Word.

The future of the world lies in the hands of the mothers and fathers of today. If we as parents live for God and righteousness God will bless us. Psalm 127 says, "Except the Lord build the house they habour in vain that build it...."Lo, children are an heritage of the Lord, and the fruit of the womb is his reward. As arrows are in the hand of a mighty man; so are children of the youth.

There is at the marriage altar when vows are exchanged and sacred trusts are made a peculiar loveliness and radient light upon the countenance of two lives united together that helps us to realize anew that God is love and he wants to bless the family and home. Also in my own experience when the first child was born, there was a renewed love my wife and I had for each other as we held in our arms the new life God had given us. This was true also when each one of our four children were born. When our last child was born my wife was in danger and I spent a sleepless night. In the morning light I thanked God that he had spared her life and given us another child to bless our home.

Jesus warned against despising children in Matthew 18:10, "Take heed that ye despise not one of these little ones; for I say unto you, that in heaven their angels do always behold the face of my Father which is in heaven." I have a picture at home of a beautiful angel watching over a sleeping child. There is another picture I have seen of two children, a boy and a girl crossing a deep canyon on a little foot bridge, the bridge is old and some of the boards are gone. It is getting dark and the children are going hand in hand accross, seemingly unaware of the danger, but just above them is a guardian angel to guide them safely accross. The scripture I just read says beware that you despise not one of these little one. If God is so concerned about their welfare that he delegates angels to watch over them, just think how blessed we are for God to place them in our hands, what a sacred trust. How we should be careful to fulfill our mission to teach them in right ways. Proverbs 22:6 says "Train up a child in the way he should go; and when he is old, he will not depart from it."

Jesus warned against turning a child away from God. Matthew 18:6. "But whoso shall affend one of these little ones which believe in me, it were better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck, and that he were drowned in the depth of the sea."

We as parents have the responsebility of providing for the needs of our children; physically, mentally, and spiritualy. We can provide for them the guidance and instruction to make them a success or a failure; happiness or misery; heaven or hell. What a blessed privilage we enjoy of rearing our children in the ways of Godliness and holiness.

The scripture lesson says, you will be blessed. Proverbs 17:6 says, "Children's children are the crown of old men, and the glory of children are their fathers." A christian father and mother are honored by their children, and the grandchildren are the delight of the grand-parents.

God's way is a blessed way, God's way is the right way. If we take His way our children and our grandchildren will rise up and call us bledsed, but if we fail to walk in God's way there will be a day when our children will curse us; As Joshua said to the children of Israel I set before you a blessing or a curse. If you follow God blessing will come, if you follow not God's way cursing will come. This basic principle still holds true today. Which way will you take?

Isaiah prophsied of Jesus. 40:11. "He shall feed his flock like a shepherd, he shall gathe the lambs with his arm, and carry them in his bosom, and shall gently lead those that are with young." Here we see the picture of Jesus love for the family. May we as parents realize the love and tender care Jesus has for us and our children. If we will heed his call, listen to his voice and follow him, he will lead our family along the uneven journey of life to a home in heaven where we can be as my mother used to pray, "An unbroken family around his throne."

I would like to speak to you on the topic; "Why settle for less."

He went to his creditors with a proposition, if they would mark his account "Paid in Full" he would give each one half of what was due him. Would they settle for that?

Most of them agreed. Better to get half a bad debt than nothing at all. They glumly accepted the partial payment for the whole.

Maybe, under the circumstances. these businessman handled a difficult situation wisely. (this happened in depression days.) yet in the spiritual realm it is never necessary to devalue God's promises. He is able to pay in full! To settle for less shaows a lack of earnestness and faith.

A young man making good meney as a salesman found his job standing in the way when he sought the Lord for salvation. He'd been selling bar fixtures to liquor joints.

Friands advised him to keep on with the job, since he needed it to support his family, work was had? to get. The young man tried to keep selling bar fixtures and be Christian, but his religiowasn't real. He was settling for a troubled, uneasy experience that fell far short of the "no condemnation" victory promised in the Bible. Not until he gave up that profitable but polluted work did he find real salvation. Full heart satisfaction becomes a personal experience for the one who refuses to settle for less.

In the early days of our country a young man was expelled from college for making the statement that one of his professors had no religion. The charge may have been true, and enyyow. David Brainerd apologized for his bluntness and requested re-admission; but he was finished at that school. Acollege education meant much to David. For how could he fulfull his call to preach without?

He went to the only fold willing to listen to a man without a college degree - the Indians.

Preaching to the unresponsive red men was difficult and discouraging. Of course, it paid nothing, in money. It meant putting off indifinitely marriage to a charming girl. It drove the boy to long hours of desperate praying in the cold. damp forests for God's anointing on his ministry.

His forest-dwelling listeners were moved, in time, to tears, by the earnest young minister's appeal. That the stolid savages counted be made to weep over their sins was almost unbelievable. The House of God - Bethel

Goodmorning, this is R. V. Bibbs again coming to you on this Tuesday morning, Yesterday, I spoke to you about Enoch and the Walk that Pleases God. Today I want to refer to another Old Testament character named Jacob and a place called Bethel which he called the house of God.

The scripture lesson is found in Genesis 28:16-19 " And Jacob awaked out of his sleep, and he said, Surely the Lord is in this place; and Iknew it not. and he was afraid, and said, How dreadful is this place? this is none other but the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven. And Jacob rose early in the morning, and took the stone that he had but for his pillows, and set it up for a pillar and pored oil upon the top of it. And he called the name of that place Bethel."

The transformation of Jacob is an interesting study. He is portrayed as a scheming, grasping, overreaching man; but Jehovah becomes the God of Jacob, and later we read the remarkable record, "He hath not behold iniquity in Jacob, neither hath he seen perverseness in Israel." There had been injustice, wrong, and iniquity; but mercy had washed it away, and "Blessed is the man to whom the Lord imputeth not sin." Jacob's first revelation of God came to ho m at Bether where he tarried all night. The Lord appeared to him in a dream, he saw the ladder of salvation. It was set up on the earth and reached all the way to Heaven. Human ladders of morality, formality and self-righteousness are all too short; there man-made ladders reach no further than the tomb, whereas the ladder that Jacob saw reached all the way to God The angels of God were ascending and descending upon it, proving the ministry of angels. They are sent to minister to them who are hears of salvation

It was at Bether that the Lord gave Jacob the sevenfold promise of blessing, temporal and spiritual, embracing protection and salvation which would be world-wide. When he awoke out of his sleep he confessed, "The Lord is in this place, and I knew it not." He was afraid, and went on to say, "How dreadful is this place! " Conviction always precedes salvation, fear takes hold of a truly convicted soul. We need more real conviction in our meetings today, in which sin becomes exceeding sinful, and where there are more tears of repentance, more agony over the guilt of sin. The popular idea is so shallow that there is a danger of flossing over the past; it has become a change of mind rather than a change of heart. True repentance is a change of nature. This revelation of God at Bethel made Jacob a different man, and this experience corresponds with the New Testament regeneration. This is clearly proved by his testimomy and life. "This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven." The house of God is the place where God resides; it is not necessarily bricks and stone, but the place where the soul meets God. The ladder of salvation reached to the gate of Heavrn; this is exactly opposite to the gate of Hell. "And Jacob rose early in the morning, and took the stone of witness, and poured oil upon the top of it."That was a remarkable morning- could he ever forget it? How many of us can look back to that memorable morning after our sins had been forgiven the night before; the morning when everything had become new, and we took the stones of witness, and told out of a full heart that Jesus had bacome our Savior. We poured oil upon the top of the stone, and the Holy Spirit whispered, "You are born of God." "And he called the name of the place Bether." Have you a hallowed spot somewhere that you call "Bethel"/

I remember so well the little county school house called Nesbit where I met God. I was about 11 years old, a revival was going on there and one night when the invitation was given, God spoke to me and I went forward and found God, He gave me parden for all my sins. He gave me peace in place of fear and dread. He started me on the road of happiness. That night that little school house became to me the house of God.

Perhaps someone is listening to me today who remembers with joy and pleasure the place where you met God and he made you His child. You remember the vows you made. Jacob made a vow that if the Lord would bless and protect him he would surely give a tenth of all he possessed

Every child of God should be careful in paying the tenth to the Lord, and should also be faithful in his love-offerings to the Lord. There is a danger of being loud in the testimony meetings and being lax in giving. and then wondering why "The caterpillars have come to eat up the fruit." "The tithe is the Lord's," but the offerings must be given as he hathpurposed in his heart, "not grudgingly, or of necessity; for God loveth a cheerful giver."

Perhaps someone is listening who has wondered away from the vows you made when you found God. Not only in yourgiving to Him but in other things that God showed you were so important. Your peace has gone, the joy that once you had is now merely a memory, Saton has robbed you, sin has bound you, and conscience smites you. Why not arise and go up to Bether, and make there an altar unto God who appeared to thee in the day when you were converted?
