He set his face to go to Jerusalem. Intro. As the third year of Jesus ministry came to its close and it came time for the great annual feast of the Passover. It is said that as many as two or three millions of strangers were gathered in Jerusalem on such an occasion. They not only flocked from every part of Palestine, but came over sea and land from all the countries in which the seed of Abraham were scattered, in order to celebrate the event in which their national history began. Describe

They came for various reason: some came with solemn thoughts and deep religious joy. Some looked forward chiefly to reunion with relative and friends, others came chiefly to make mony. many came to see Jesus whom they had heard

Many had hopes that Jesus whould become their King and break the yoke of the Roman Government.

The religious athoraties dreaded His coming for fear He would again expose them in their hypocrocy.

6 days before the Pasover began, He arrived in Bethany, the village of His friends Martha, Mary and Lazarus, which lay half-an hour from the city on the other side of the summit of the Mount of Olives.

He had been accompanied the last 20 miles of His journey by an immense multitude of the pilgrims, to whom He was dthe center of interest. They had seen Hem healing blind Bartimaeus at Jericho, and the miracle had produced among them extraordinary excitement. Then they reached Bethany, the villagw was ringing with the recent resurrection of Lazarus, and they carried on the news to the crowds who had already arrived from all quarters in Jerusalem, that Jesus had come.

After resting over the Sabbath in Bethany, He came forth on the Sunday morning to proceed to the city, The crowds welcomed Him with enthusias, and began to shout "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"

What to Expect in Sanctification

Scripture: Romans 6:17-23 Mt. 6- M

Text: V. 22 "But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life."

1. Freedom from sin.

Paul indicates that the entirely sanctified man enjoys a freedom from beyond that of eny other person. He is free from its polution, free from its presence withon his heart. He is not free from the possibility of sin, nor free from temptation, nor removed from a world wheresin is evident on every hand. He is free from the proneness to sinning which he knew before, free from that inner "fifth column" which joined hands with temptation and made it doubly difficult to resist. He is more fully the servant of God t than he has ever been, having yielded himself and his every member to God for use as He sees fit. 2. Perfection of Love I John 4:17 Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because as he is, so are we in this world.

The perfection of love was not in the decisciples untill pentecost. Self selbring, place seeking levergeful.

3. Fruit unto Holiness. Glations 5:22-23
But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith,

Meekness, temperance: against such there is

no law.

The fruit of the Spirit makes the sanctified life winsome and effective.

4. Wisdom from above James 3:17-18

But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be entreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy.

And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace

of them that make peace.

God is the center of his life. He keeps the intelle in subjection to the will of God. Such a life is based on purity. It is free from defilement. It is separated from everything which is from beneath. It is devoted to the service of God. Such a life is free from contending for its rights. It shows consideration for others, and manifests a sweet reasonableness under provocation. It is submissive to discipline, obedient to rules. Instead of being self-centered it acts from a whole hearted conviction of the truth to which it adheres with single-mindedness. It sows peace and reaps a harvest of rithteousness, because it is motivated by a living, loving faith and not a dead creed.

And when they had prayed, the place was shaken where they were assembled together, and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they spake the word of God with boldness.
