This eighth chapter of Romans pictures the highest esperience one can have this side of heave It reveals the sanctified man under all conditions of life as a victorious man, The first verse ex-

presses this

"There is there fore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit". Here is a soul no longer bothered by a double nature; no longer with a spirit in opposition to the law of God; but a soul following one Master, and he the Spirit of God. Up until this time two great principles embodied in laws have been working a against each other, bringing wretchedness into his life. (See Romans 7:21-23). Now another law comes ina and takes over. It is "the law of the spirit of life in Christ Jesus," and it has dilivered from both the law which revealed sin and the the law which brought death.

The law of God which was holy, just, and good, by its restraints was always trying to make men holy; but because of carnality it could not.

What the law could not do, Jesus Christ has dome by condemming to death that which opposed the working of the law of God in man's life. "For what the law could not do, in that it was weak through the flesh, God sending hisown Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and for sin, condemned sin in the flesh"

We have just come through# the time of year when the birds begin to sing after a winter of silence. God has made so many different kinds. The Bible refers to 40 different species of birds. Jesus said in Matthew 6:26 "Behold the fowls of the air". It is very important in the study of the Bible to notice the many references about natural history. 593 times the Bible referred to it.

The first sound that struck the human ear may have been the sound of a bird's voice.

The raven and the dove were used by Noah to see if the earth was dried up.

When Jesus was babtized the Holy Spirit desended on Him in the form of a dove.

David with Saul after him says: "I am hunted as a partiridew on the mountains. "And speaking of his forlorn condition he says:"I am like a pelican of the wilderness." Also in referring to his loneliness he says: "I am a swallow alone on a housetop.

When Hezekiah was emaciated by sickness he compares himself to a crane, thin and wasted.

When Job had so much trouble he could not sleep nights he says: "I am a companion to owls."

Jeremiah describing the reuelty of parents who leave their children to the ostrich who leaves its eggs in the sand uncared for, crying: "The daughter of m y people is checocome like the ostriches of the wilderness,"

The Lord taught the children of Israel a lesson in the wilderness by giving them quail for breakfast.

The prophet in ellustrating the waywordness of his people says: "The stork knoweth her appointed time and the turtle and the crane and the wwallow the time of their going, but my people know not the judgements of the Lord." The word "stork" ordinarily means mercy and affection Distinguished for its great love to its parents.

heritage prophet describing the church cries out: "Mine the bird, the birds round

God compares his treatment of his people to the eagle's car care of the eaglets. Deut. 32:11 "As an eagle stirreth up her nest, fluttereth over her young, spreadeth abroad her wings, taketh them, beareth them on her wings, so the Lord alone did nead him." in the form of a dove.

It was thought in ancient times that an eagle could not only molt his feathers in old age, but that after arriving to great age he would renew his strength and become entirely young again. To Isaiah refers when he says: "They that wait on the Lord shall remew their strength, they wollow shall mount up with wings as eagles.

In refereng to the brevity of life Job says: "Swift as an eagle that hasteth to its prey."

Jesus said, as a hen gathers her chick under her wings, so he wants to gather us. When danger comes, such as a hawk flying overhead. The mother hen gives a funny little sound and the luttle chickens come running and she spreads her wings over them. The little chick sometimes peak out but if they are wise they will stay until all dager is past. If we want safety we must stay close to Jesus.

Twenty times the Bible refers to birds nests in showing the wonderous care of God for His people.

Over fifty times does the old Book refere to the wing, "Wings of a dove, Wings of the morning, Wings of the wind,, Sun of righteousness with healing in his wings," Wings of the Almighty."
