## "Who is my Neighbor" (Missionary)

Scripture Reading Luke 10:25-37 Text v.29 "Who is my neighbor"

A. Intro: The Scripture lesson from which the title of this message is taken presents the subject of Holiness and Missions.

1. The saints of God are interested in the spread

of the Gospel throughout the world. Sometimes people quote the unscriptural proverb, "Charity begins at home," but true Christains deli light to sing: Wardings as

"Oh that the world might taste and see

- 2. The man of God is a true all around man, and it is joy and delight to carry out the command of Jesus "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations."
- B. Jesus settled the question of the relationship of holiness and missions in this scripture lesson.
- 1. The lawyer's query was, "What shall I do to inherit eternal life? "Jesus answered by a question, "Ho readest thou?" Then-the lawyer gave God's difinition of holiness: "Thou shalt love the Lord thy Bod with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbour as thyself." From this we may learn. that:

(a) Holiness is perfect love to God.

- (b) Love to God means love to our fellow man. "If we love one another, God dwelleth in us, and his love is perfected in us."
- 2. Then we note the lawyer's quibbling. "Who is my neighbour?" How lawyer-like. perhaps he thought here was a chance for argument. Perhaps he wanted to mustiby himself without being what God wanted him to be, wanted to throw the thing back on God and make the law appear impossible. There are those who take a similar position about missions both at home and abroad.

- 3. Christ's answer to this question "Who is my neighbour?"came in the form of the Parable of the Good Samaritan. This parable, among other things, teaches us that our neighbor is the one who needs us, not simply those who are closest by ties of blood or n nationality. - 4. By the same logic Jesus used, then our nearest neighbor is the one who needs us most.
- C. This lession brings to our attention the needs of our neighbor who is to be found in all the neglected churchless and christless regions of the world.

to face with utter spiritual darkness.

## D. Conclusion.
