The first mention of Elijah is in the first verse of this ch. There he was delivering a message to Ahab, the king of Iarael: "as the Lord God of Israwl liveth, before whom I stand, there shall not be dew nor rain these years. but according to my word" That was a drastic message and the messenger needed protection. God provided it. He said to Elijah, "Get thee hence, and turn thee eastward, and hide thyself by the brook Cherith, that is before Jordan." The prophet obeyed and hid well; for later when Obadiah, Ahab's servant, met him, he informed Elijah that the king had sought him in every nation and found him not. He had done a good job in hiding.

It should be held in mind that Elijah was dealing with Israel's most wicked king. "Ahab did more to provoke the Lord God of Israel to anger than all the kings of Israel
